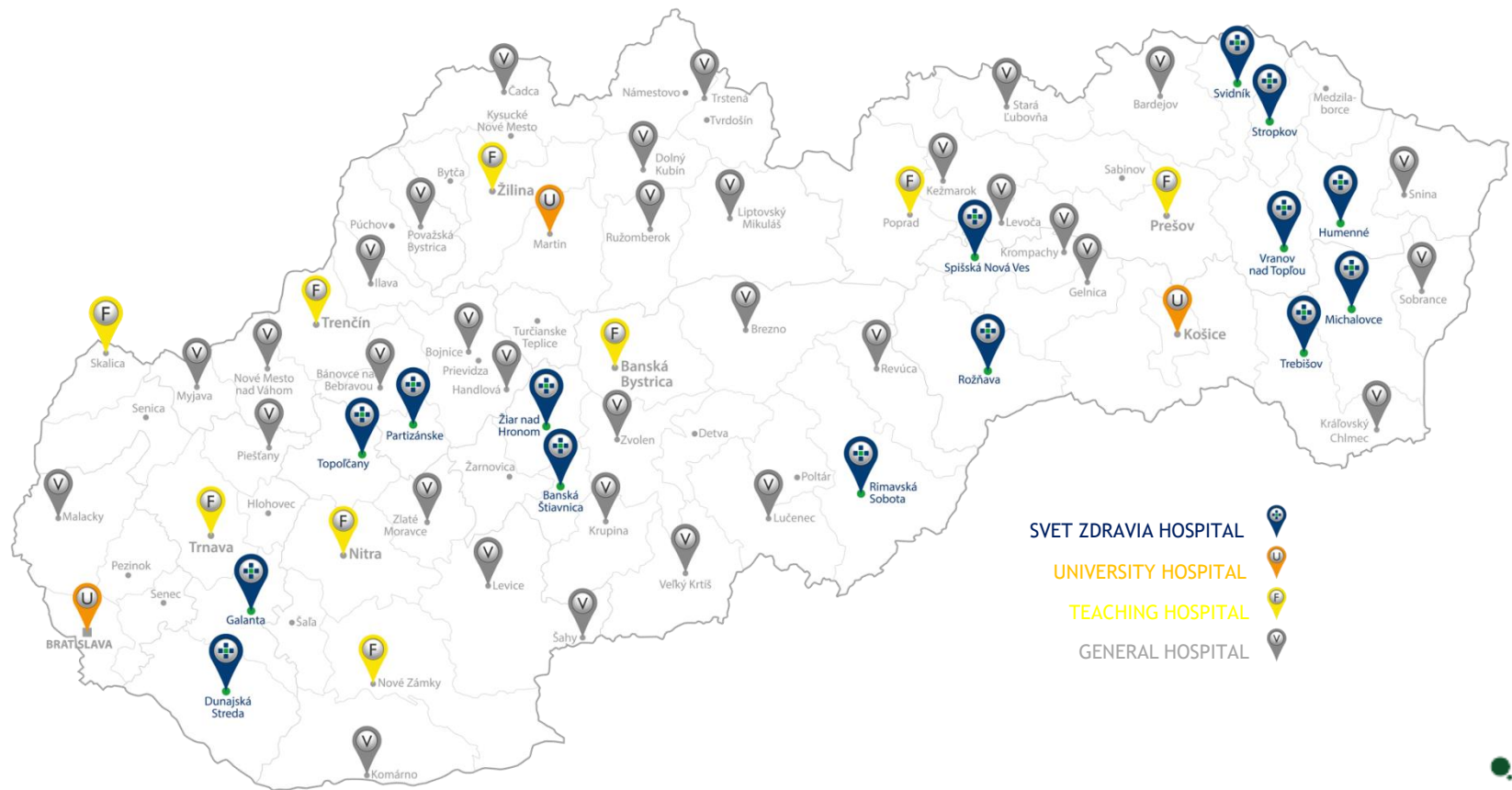

## Nurses claim they need over 15k new employees

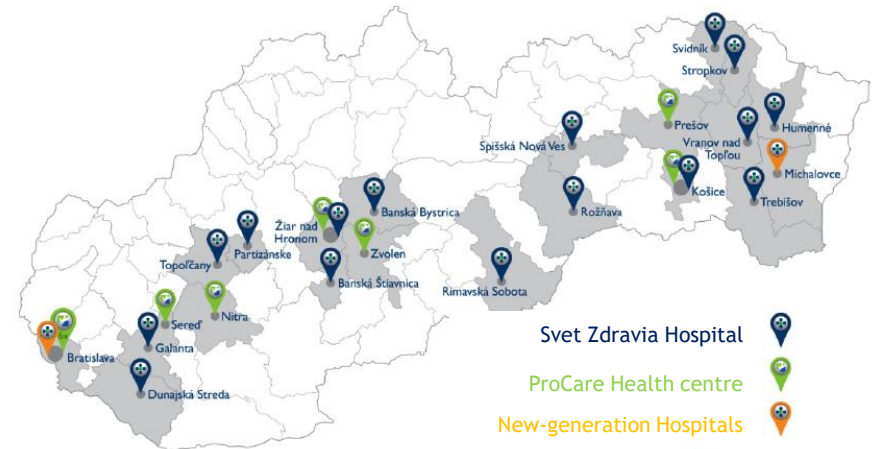


# Main reasons for stratification

- **Long-term sustainability**
  - Economical
  - Staffing
- **Health Care Quality**
- **Rapid development of medicine**
  - Diagnosis and therapy
- **Demographic changes**
  - Ageing of population and low birth-rate
  - Urbanization

- 339 “floating” beds in the new building (75 single-bed rooms)
- 8 operating theatres; Emergency ward
- Organized in medicinal clusters
- New-generation Emergency ward and Maternity Hospital
- Central medicine making

# Major organizational changes in the hospital's functioning: clusters and floating beds

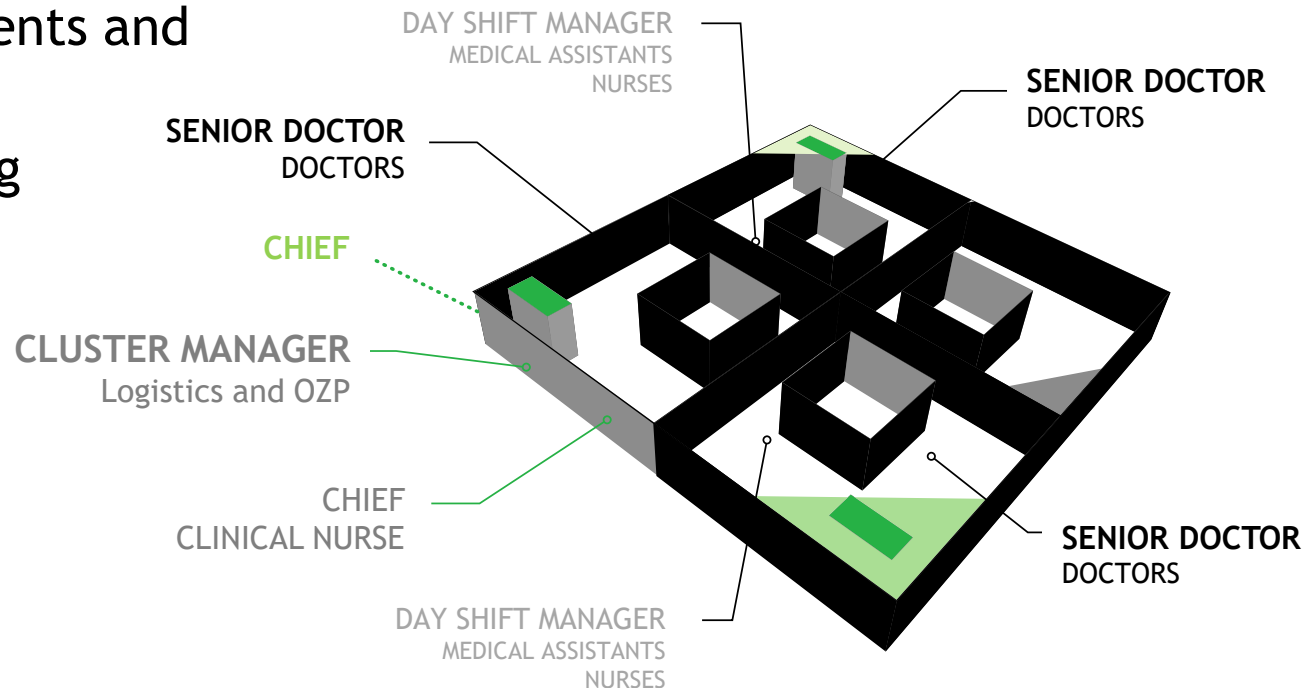
- Clustering of the departments and floating beds
  - Clusters in the new-generation hospital:

Cluster	Departments
Internal	Internal Medicine, Neurology, Pulmonary
Surgical	Surgery, Traumatology, Urology, Orthopedy
Woman and child	Maternity Hospital, Gynaecology, Neonatology, Paediatrics
OAMIS and Emergency ward	Anaesthesiology and multi-area intensive care, Emergency ward
Diagnostical	Radio-diagnostics, CT, MRI, Mammography, Sonography
Central operating theatres	Central operating theatres, Central sterilization

# Eastern Slovakia Svet Zdravia Hospitals Stratification plan

## ○ Large acute care hospital

- Above-region acute care center with more than 400 beds
- More than 4 specializations and network competence centers
- 24/7 Emergency ward, OAMIS a complex diagnostics

## ○ Acute care general hospital

- 200 to 400 beds
- 4 specializations
- Emergency ward,
- OAMIS with radio-diagnostics

## ● Elective small hospital

- Only one-day surgery, not 24/7
- After care for acute care hospitals

## ● Specialized centers

- Specialized elective hospitals focused at 1-3 operations
- Regional competence centers
- Without acute care
